Nurses' Role When Disaster Strikes

Course Overview

Domestic Preparedness has been designed to assist nurses and other professional medical disaster responders improve preparedness for the health care consequences of CBRNE events and naturally occurring catastrophes. The course is intended to augment existing preparedness or other terrorism-related programs.

This 4-hour course has been developed by the Illinois Medical Emergency Response Team, and INVENT, the Illinois Nurse Team, in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Illinois College of Emergency Physicians under an ASPR grant.

Target Audience

Domestic Preparedness is appropriate for physicians, nurses, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, EMTs, first responders and non-medical community members with an interest in emergency preparedness and response to CBRNE/MCI events.

Course Objectives

- List and describe the basic disaster scenarios issued by the Department of Homeland Security: Nuclear Detonation; Biological Outbreak; Natural Disaster; and Chemical, Radiological, Explosive.
- Based on the Hazard Vulnerability Analysis (HVA), list and describe the four priority disaster scenarios including tornadoes; earthquakes; pandemic flu; and explosives
- Identify the challenges of caring for special needs populations in disasters
- Recall the mission, evolution and capabilities of the Illinois Medical Emergency Response Team (IMERT) and INVENT, the Illinois Nurse Team and how they relate to the Illinois Emergency Response system
- Detail the characteristics of the successful disaster response nurse and other health professions
- Define the issues related to altered standards of care specific to disasters
- Describe the challenges to recovery after an incident
